Mainstreaming Checklist

1.	The child has become familiar with the rules and routines of the regular class in which he/she will be mainstreamed
2.	The student's Individual Educational Plan objectives and modifications have been discussed with mainstreamed teacher
3.	The child has indicated a positive desire to participate in a regular class environment
4.	The child has been coached on how to deal with possible reactions and situations presented by other students m, both positive and negative
5.	The child is capable of remaining focused for appropriate periods of time while in the regular classroom
6.	The mainstreamed classroom teacher has been educated on the special needs of the disabled child
7.	The mainstreamed teacher has been given the proper assistance on the use and purpose of any devices or apparatus used by the disabled student
8.	The mainstreamed teacher has been appraised of the student's skill levels
9.	The mainstream teacher has been appraised of the child's learning style
10.	The mainstreamed teacher has been appraised of the child's strength areas and limitations
11.	The mainstreamed teacher has been informed of the supportive services provided to the student
12.	The mainstreamed teacher has prepared his/her class for the incoming student

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3The mainstreamed teacher has been assigned a specific special service staff member to contact in case of some difficulty
4The mainstreamed teacher has been given the proper management skills that might be required in dealing with the child while in the mainstreamed class
5The students in the mainstreamed class have been educated on handicapping conditions and the reasons for mainstreaming
6The child's parents have met the mainstreamed teacher
7The child's parents have been involved in the planning of their child's mainstreaming experience
8The child's parents have been given assistance on parenting techniques that will encourage the child's progress and increase the chances of success of the mainstreaming experience
9A member of the mainstreaming team has presented the concept of mainstreaming, its purpose and what is gained at a PTA meeting for parents of non disabled children
20The administrator has been informed of the mainstreaming procedure for this particular child.
